Last Game: Thursday, Nov. 3 – Denver 102, Minnesota 99

Danilo Gallinari and Jusuf Nurkic combined for 18 points in the pivotal third quarter as Denver rallied to beat the Timberwolves, 102-99, on Thursday night at Target Center. Karl-Anthony Towns triggered a 20-6 barrage that put Minnesota on top by 15 late in the first period, which ended with the Wolves leading 37-25 thanks to 14 points apiece from Towns and Andrew Wiggins. The Nuggets sliced the deficit to 41-40 midway through the second, but late baskets by Zach LaVine and Towns rebuilt Minnesota's cushion to 61-55. Denver then held the Wolves to just one field goal over an eight-minute stretch of the third period and extended its lead to 88-75 by quarter's end. A pair of Nemanja Bjelica treys started Minnesota's comeback and Towns cut it to 99-97 with 2:43 to play. However, Emmanuel Mudiay converted a three-point play and the Wolves came up empty on their final three trips, with Bjelica misfiring on the tying 3-point attempt as time expired. Gallinari and Wilson Chandler finished with 19 points apiece for the Nuggets while Towns collected 32 points and 14 rebounds for Minnesota and Wiggins chipped in 25 points.

Previous Game: Tuesday, Nov. 1 – Minnesota 116, Memphis 80

Zach LaVine scored 31 points in three quarters as the Timberwolves routed shorthanded Memphis, 116-80, in their home opener on Tuesday night at Target Center. The opening six minutes saw the lead change hands seven times before back-to-back 3-pointers by Kris Dunn and LaVine sparked an 18-4 finish to the first quarter that left Minnesota in front by 13. Vince Carter's trey narrowed the deficit to nine early in the second, but the Wolves reeled off 15 unanswered points – including six each by LaVine and Gorgui Dieng – to stretch their lead to 62-36 by halftime. The margin crested at 40 when 3-pointers by Andrew Wiggins and Dunn made it 83-43 at the 6:47 mark of the third period, only to see the Grizzlies counter with the next 13 points and force a Minnesota timeout. The Wolves then finished the quarter with a 12-2 burst, rebuilding their advantage to 97-59 on a Brandon Rush trey in the waning seconds, and the spread stayed above 30 the rest of the way. Dieng and Wiggins tallied 17 points apiece for Minnesota, which tied the 4th-largest winning margin in franchise history, while the Grizzlies were led by 17 points from Deyonta Davis.

Minnesota snapped a 10-game losing streak vs. Oklahoma City with the Mar. 11 triumph. The Thunder have won 24 of the last 28 overall.

First Meeting: Kevin Durant scored 30 points, including the final 12 for Oklahoma City, and Russell Westbrook added 22 points and 11 assists to hold off the Wolves, 101-96, on Jan. 12 at Target Center. Andrew Wiggins led Minnesota with 22 points while Zach LaVine tallied 21.

Second Meeting: Russell Westbrook completed his fourth triple-double of the season (12 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists) in three quarters and Kevin Durant added 21 points and seven assists as Oklahoma City rolled past the Timberwolves, 113-93, on Jan. 15 at Chesapeake Energy Arena. Andrew Wiggins tallied 25 points and Shabazz Muhammad chipped in 15 for Minnesota.

Third Meeting: Kevin Durant scored 27 points, including back-to-back jumpers in the closing moments, and Russell Westbrook added 24 points and 15 assists as Oklahoma City outlasted the Wolves, 126-123, on Jan. 27 at Target Center. Zach LaVine led Minnesota with a season-high 35 points while Karl-Anthony Towns collected 19 points and 13 rebounds.

Fourth Meeting: Gorgui Dieng scored a career-high 25 points and Ricky Rubio drilled the game-winning 3-pointer with :00.2 remaining as the Timberwolves ended a seven-year drought in Oklahoma City with a 99-96 victory on Mar. 11 at Chesapeake Energy Arena. Kevin Durant led the Thunder with 28 points and Russell Westbrook collected 26 points and eight assists.

Kevin Martin and Andrew Wiggins finished with 16 points apiece for Minnesota while Brook Lopez topped the Nets with 20 points and 12 rebounds.

Second Meeting: Karl-Anthony Towns scored 28 points, Andrew Wiggins had 26 and the Wolves shot a club-record 68.4% from the floor in routing Brooklyn, 132-118, on Mar. 5 at Target Center. Ricky Rubio totaled 16 points, seven rebounds and 10 assists for Minnesota, while Markel Brown led the Nets with 23 points and Thomas Robinson contributed 18 points and 17 rebounds.

Kris Dunn, the Wolves' 1st-round selection (5th overall) in the 2016 NBA Draft, is the sole rookie... Last October, the Wolves returned nine of 16 players from their final 2014-15 roster; they kept nine of 15 from 2013-14 to 2014-15 and also nine of 15 from 2012-13 to 2013-14... The current roster averages 3.6 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 26.1 years; last year's Opening Night group was at 5.1 and 27.6 years, respectively (4.0 and 25.6 in 2014-15; 3.7 and 26.0 in 2013-14)... Nikola Peković remains atop the Wolves' seniority list, beginning his seventh season; Ricky Rubio enters year number six...

WOLF TRACKS: Denver spotted the Wolves a 15-point, 1st-quarter cushion before rallying to win, 102-99, on Thursday night at Target Center... *Minnesota has now built leads of 15+ points in all four of its games to date, but has let three of those slip away;* they rolled to a 17-point lead in the 1st quarter on Opening Night (Oct. 26) at Memphis and went ahead by 18 early in the 2nd period last Saturday at Sacramento... The Wolves made their Target Center debut for the 2016-17 regular season with Tuesday's 116-80 win over Memphis, avenging the loss at FedExForum; *the final 36-point margin equals the 4th-largest victory in club history* and is the 18th time overall the Wolves have won by 30+... Minnesota improves to 19-8 all-time in Target Center openers (0-1 at the Metrodome), highlighted by 13 straight wins from 1995-96 through 2006-07... The Wolves fell 106-101 to Portland in last year's home opener (Nov. 2), ending a three-game winning streak in that category... *Minnesota shot 55.1% (43-for-78) vs. Memphis on Tuesday, its best percentage ever in a home opener;* previously, the Wolves had hit 54.4% (49-for-90) in a 129-113 win over Golden State on Oct. 31, 1997... WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota wrapped up its 2016 preseason slate with a 5-2 record following the 109-74 win over Charlotte on Oct. 21 at Target Center, avenging a 98-86 loss to the Hornets on Oct. 10 at Time Warner Cable Arena... *The Wolves are now 108-93 all-time in exhibition outings*, going 29-15 at Target Center; they've registered six winning preseason records in the past seven years, having finished 6-2 in 2010, 2-0 in 2011, 5-2 in 2012, 4-3 in 2013 and 5-2 in 2014 before dipping to 2-5 last October... The final 35-point spread vs. Charlotte equaled Minnesota's 2nd-largest winning margin ever in the preseason; they posted a 117-79 win at Milwaukee on Oct. 6, 2008... The Wolves made their Target Center debut for 2016-17 with a 101-94 victory over Memphis on Oct. 19 – in the 200th preseason contest in franchise history... *It was the first of three meetings with the Grizzlies in a two-week stretch*; Memphis returns to Target Center tonight for the Wolves' home opener... The Wolves completed a five-game, nine-night road swing with the 112-94 loss on Oct. 16 in Oklahoma City... They defeated Miami twice during the sojourn (109-100 on Oct. 8 in Kansas City; 101-96 on Oct. 15 in Louisville) while dropping the 98-86 decision Oct. 10 at Charlotte and notching a 105-88 victory over Denver on Oct. 12 in Lincoln...

COLD AS ICE: Minnesota limited Charlotte to 74 points and 31.6% on Oct. 21, both figures representing preseason defensive bests... The Hornets' percentage is the lowest allowed by Minnesota in a preseason game since New York shot an identical 31.6% (25-for-79) on Oct. 11, 2003 at MSG (a 96-77 Wolves victory)... Meanwhile, Oklahoma City's 112 points and 50.0% shooting on Oct. 16 were both preseason highs for a Wolves opponent; Minnesota bounced back to hold Memphis to 94 points and 39.8% on Oct. 19... *The Wolves finished 4th in preseason scoring defense (94.6 ppg) and 6th in FG percentage defense (42.1%)* while permitting the 4th-lowest three-point percentage (30.4%)... Minnesota held Denver to 88 points in the Oct. 12 victory in Lincoln, forcing 25 turnovers while limiting the Nuggets to a 3-for-20 effort from beyond the arc... The Wolves swiped a preseason-best 14 steals in that game and added 13 steals vs. Charlotte on Oct. 21; *Minnesota ranked 9th in preseason steals (10.14 spg) and 3rd in blocked shots (6.71 bpg)*...

BOARD GAMES: The Wolves outrebounded Charlotte 56-37 on Oct. 21, their second double-digit cushion of the preseason (51-36 vs. Miami, Oct. 15) and the third time in seven starts they held the upper hand... The 19-board spread was their largest in a preseason game since outrebounding New York 62-35 on Oct. 6, 2010... Oklahoma City enjoyed a 47-37 margin on Oct. 16, Minnesota's sole double-digit deficit; their 37 total rebounds were a preseason low... Overall, *the Wolves compiled a +3.9 rpg margin (47.1-43.3) while ranking 5th in total rebounding pct (.523)*, 8th in defensive rebounding pct (.797) and 7th in offensive rebounding pct (.248)... Karl-Anthony Towns was 7th individually (9.3 rpg), registering two of Minnesota's three double-doubles; his 14 rebounds Oct. 15 vs. Miami equaled the most by any Wolves player in a preseason contest since Nikola Pekovic had 17 vs. Chicago on Oct. 13, 2012...

FITS & STARTS: Minnesota shot a preseason-best 48.8% in the Oct. 21 finale vs. Charlotte, its second outing above 42% (48.1% vs. Miami, Oct. 15)... The Wolves were held below 40% in each of their first two starts (39.3% vs. Miami on Oct. 8; 34.7% at Charlotte on Oct. 10)... *Minnesota finished 24th in preseason FG accuracy (41.8%) and 20th in scoring (100.7 ppg)*... The Wolves went 36-for-41 from the line vs. Memphis on Oct. 19, setting preseason highs in both categories; Karl-Anthony Towns (17-for-17) and Gorgui Dieng (9-for-10) combined for 26 made free throws... *Minnesota ranked 3rd in preseason FT accuracy (79.2%) and 5th in FTs made (22.9 per game)*... The Wolves equaled their preseason best by hitting 10 treys Oct. 16 at Oklahoma City (also Oct. 8 vs. Miami)... Minnesota cracked the Century Mark in five of seven starts (including a preseason-best 109 vs. Charlotte on Oct. 21), winning all five of those...

YOUTH IS SERVED: Entering 2015-16, 31 players in NBA history averaged at least 15.0 ppg in their age-19 or age-20 seasons while qualifying for the league's scoring leaderboard. The Wolves became just the second team ever to feature two such players in the same season – Andrew Wiggins (20.7 ppg) and Karl-Anthony Towns (18.3 ppg) – joining the 2008-09 Oklahoma City Thunder (Kevin Durant, Russell Westbrook). Karl-Anthony Towns saw his NBA season-best streak of double-doubles halted at 15 in the Apr. 11 loss to Houston but is the fourth player in franchise history to post 50 double-doubles in a season. KAT'S CORNER:

TOWNS EARNS ROOKIE HONOR: On May 16, Wolves center Karl-Anthony Towns was named the recipient of the Eddie Gottlieb Trophy as the 2015-16 Kia NBA Rookie of the Year, becoming just the fifth unanimous winner of the award since 1984 and joining teammate Andrew Wiggins (the 2014-15 honoree) to make Minnesota the first team with back-to-back winners since Buffalo's Bob McAdoo and Ernie DiGregorio in 1972-73 and 1973-74. Towns received all 130 first-place votes and 650 total points (5-3-1 format) from a panel of sportswriters and broadcasters throughout the U.S. and Canada, and was the only rookie to be listed on each ballot. New York forward Kristaps Porzingis finished second in the voting with 363 points and Denver center Nikola Jokic came in third with 59 points. Towns started all 82 games for the Wolves, averaging 18.3 ppg, 10.5 rpg and 1.68 bpg while ranking 3rd among all NBA players in double-doubles (52) and 8th in FG accuracy (54.2%). He tallied 30+ points on four occasions, topped by a season-high 35-point effort in the Feb. 10 win over Toronto, and registered season highs in rebounds (21) and assists (nine) Apr. 3 vs. Dallas.

* * *

A CLEAN SWEEP: On Apr. 15, Minnesota center Karl-Anthony Towns was named the NBA's Western Conference Rookie of the Month for April. Towns, the top overall pick in the 2015 NBA Draft, led all rookies in scoring (18.9 ppg), rebounding (11.9 rpg), blocks (1.71 bpg) and double-doubles (a league-best six) while ranking 5th in both FG accuracy (49.1%) and assists (3.6 apg). He registered season highs in rebounds (21) and assists (nine) Apr. 3 vs. Dallas, becoming the NBA's first rookie to collect at least 21 rebounds and nine assists in the same game since Elgin Baylor in 1959. Towns scored 14 of his 27 points in the 4th quarter Apr. 9 at Portland, punctuated by hitting the game-winning jumper with 1.8 seconds left, and contributed 28 points and 14 rebounds in the Apr. 13 finale vs. New Orleans – a victory that saw Minnesota shoot 65.1% and ring up a franchise-record 144 points. It's Towns' sixth consecutive monthly honor; he's the eighth player since the award's inception in 1981-82 to earn six Rookie of the Month accolades, joining David Robinson, Tim Duncan, LeBron James, Carmelo Anthony, Chris Paul, Blake Griffin and Damian Lillard.

GET ME REWRITE: Karl-Anthony Towns finished with 12 points in the Apr. 11 game vs Houston, boosting his season total to 1475 and moving him past Christian Laettner for the top rookie single-season total in Wolves history. Towns overtook Kevin Garnett for 1st place on the rookie block chart Apr. 5 at Golden State and broke Kevin Love's rookie rebounding mark Mar. 25 at Washington:

TOWNS IS WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Apr. 11, Wolves center Karl-Anthony Towns was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Apr. 4-10. Towns helped Minnesota to a 3-0 record for the week – sweeping a West Coast trip that featured stops at Golden State, Sacramento and Portland – by averaging 21.3 ppg (50.0%), 10.3 rpg, 3.0 apg and 1.67 bpg. He tallied 20 points and 12 rebounds as the Timberwolves erased a 17-point, 3rd-quarter deficit to beat Golden State in OT on Apr. 5, added 17 points and 10 rebounds in the Apr. 7 victory at Sacramento, and rounded out the week with 27 points (including 14 in the 4th quarter) and nine rebounds Apr. 9 at Portland. It's the first weekly honor of Towns' career; he becomes the eighth player (and first rookie) in franchise history to win the award, joining Kevin Garnett (15 times), Kevin Love (twice), Al Jefferson (twice), Stephon Marbury (Feb. 21, 1999), Sam Cassell (Dec. 28, 2003), Nikola Pekovic (Apr. 8, 2013) and Mo Williams (Jan. 19, 2015).

* * *

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished 2015-16 with a 29-53 record, a 13-game improvement from 2014-15, when the Wolves won a league-low 16 games... It was the 3rd-largest increase in the NBA last season behind Charlotte (+15) and New York (+15), as well as the 3rd-best year-over-year bump in franchise history (+25 in 1999-2000, +14 in 1996-97)... The final record marks the fifth time in six seasons Minnesota has improved on its previous year's victory total... The Wolves have now missed the postseason in 12 straight years, after advancing to the playoffs every season from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought – Sacramento (10) and Phoenix (six) are next on that list – and equals the 2nd-longest in NBA history behind the Clippers franchise's 15-year siesta from 1976-77 through 1990-91 while drifting from Buffalo to San Diego to Los Angeles... Minnesota opened the season by splitting its first 16 games (through Nov. 27) before dropping 26 of its next 34 to tumble to 14-36... However, the Wolves recovered to put together a 15-17 record over their final 32 games (beginning Feb. 3), highlighted by a three-game West Coast sweep in April that featured wins at playoff-bound Golden State (124-117 on Apr. 5) and Portland (106-105 on Apr. 9)... Minnesota finished 15-26 away from Target Center, the only team in the NBA last season to win more games on the road than at home...

SCHEDULE NOTES: The Wolves won four of seven April starts, their first winning final month since going 6-4 in 2005 – highlighted by rallying from 17 points back to defeat Golden State, 124-117 in OT, on Apr. 5 at Oracle Arena... Over its final 35 games, Minnesota went 8-9 vs. teams with winning records but 7-11 vs. sub-.500 opponents... The Apr. 7 win at Sacramento hiked the Wolves' record to 10-8 vs. Pacific Division opponents, the first time they've ended above .500 vs. the Pacific since 2004-05 (also 10-8)... The Mar. 26 loss to Utah completed the final of 14 back-to-back sets for Minnesota; they finished 6-8 in the first and 2-12 in the second game of back-to-backs... The Wolves erased last-minute deficits in the 4th quarter and both OTs to edge Washington, 132-129, on Mar. 25 at the Verizon Center... That win came in Minnesota's final game vs. an Eastern Conference opponent for the season; they went 11-19 vs. the East (9-21 last year, 17-13 in 2013-14)... Coupled with the 113-104 triumph vs. Sacramento on Mar. 23, it was the first time Minnesota had enjoyed a winning streak since Feb. 3-6 (at L.A. Clippers, vs. Chicago)... The Mar. 7 defeat at Charlotte capped a run in which the Wolves played seven of nine vs. Eastern teams; it also concluded the second and final four-games-in-five-nights grind (Nov. 9-13)... Dallas routed the Wolves 128-101 loss on Feb. 28; the 27-point spread represented Minnesota's biggest loss in 2015-16...

ROAD TESTED: Minnesota completed its final road trip with a 3-0 record following the 106-105 victory at Portland on Apr. 9, ending an eight-game drought at the Moda Center... It's the fifth time in club history the Wolves have put together an unbeaten trip of at least three games, the first since going 4-0 from Dec. 2-7, 2005... Minnesota went 6-3 in its final nine away from Target Center, with four of the wins coming vs. opponents heading to the postseason (Oklahoma City, Memphis, Golden State, Portland)... Minnesota wrapped up a 2-2 trip with the 116-111 loss at Houston on Mar. 18; the four-game swing began with a buzzer-beating 99-96 victory at Oklahoma City on Mar. 11 and included a 114-108 win in Memphis on Mar. 16... The latter victory was just the Wolves' second at FedExForum in the last seven years, while the Mar. 11 triumph was their first in Oklahoma City since November 2008... Minnesota halted its five-game losing streak with the 108-102 victory Feb. 3 at the Clippers, in the finale of a four-game Western swing; the win also ended the Wolves' 14-game series slide vs. Los Angeles... The Clippers win stopped Minnesota's 12-game losing streak away from Target Center...

FINDING THE RANGE: The Wolves shot a blistering 65.1% in the season-ending Apr. 13 triumph over New Orleans, their 17th 50%+ outing in the last 41 contests... Minnesota hit 48.3% (106.3 ppg) in those 41 – including a franchise-record 68.4% in the Mar. 5 win over Brooklyn – after reaching the 50% mark just four times in its first 41 (44.6% and 98.6 ppg)... The 48.3% mark ranked 2nd in the NBA (behind only Golden State's 49.0%) over the season's second half; the Wolves also placed 2nd in True Shooting Percentage at 56.9% (trailing Golden State's 59.7%) and 7th in Effective FG Percentage during that stretch... The Wolves have tallied 130+ points on 10 occasions all time, with three of those coming in the final six weeks of 2015-16 (132 vs. Brooklyn, Mar. 5; 132 at Washington, Mar. 25)... Overall, Minnesota finished 15th in scoring (102.4 ppg) and 7th in FG accuracy (46.4%)... They also ranked 8th in assists (23.4 apg); the 41 assists vs. New Orleans on Apr. 13 were a single-game high in the NBA last season...
