Last Game: Wednesday, Nov. 1 – Minnesota 104, New Orleans 98

Jimmy Butler scored 23 points, including the tie-breaking three-point play with 34.2 seconds left, as the Timberwolves edged New Orleans 104-98 on Wednesday night at the Smoothie King Center. The Pelicans rode DeMarcus Cousins to erase an early eight-point deficit, but treys from Nemanja Bjelica and Jamal Crawford in the final five seconds put Minnesota back on top, 31-28. Butler's dunk gave the Wolves a 60-48 lead with 1:54 left before halftime. New Orleans opened the third with a 15-4 burst and pulled even on Anthony Davis' dunk at the 2:20 mark, only to see Minnesota reel off the next 11 points, capped by a Shabazz Muhammad jumper that rebuild an 88-77 cushion with 10:09 remaining in the fourth. Six straight points from Tony Allen kick-started the Pelicans' comeback and two Cousins free throws again tied it at 98-98 with 1:45 to play. However, New Orleans came up empty on its last four possessions and Butler scored the game's final six points. Taj Gibson pulled in 12 rebounds for Minnesota while Cousins netted 35 points, nine rebounds and six steals for the Pelicans and Davis collected 24 points and 10 boards.

Previous Game: Monday, Oct. 30 – Minnesota 125, Miami 122 (OT)

Jeff Teague scored seven of his 23 points in overtime and added 11 assists and a career-high six steals to help the Timberwolves rally past Miami, 125-122, on Monday night at AmericanAirlines Arena. Minnesota spotted the Heat a 10-point lead by misfiring on its first eight shots, and Kelly Olynyk's trey gave Miami its largest cushion of the night at 51-38 in the second quarter. The Wolves reeled off 12 unanswered points and inched ahead until Goran Dragic's 3-pointer beat the buzzer to put the Heat in front 62-60 at halftime. Minnesota opened a six-point edge late in the third, but Dragic capped a 9-0 finish that gave Miami an 82-79 lead entering the fourth quarter. The Wolves regrouped to pull ahead 104-97 with 3:09 remaining, only to see Dion Waiters tally 11 points during an ending 13-6 run that forced overtime. Minnesota never trailed in the extra session, using treys from Karl-Anthony Towns and Teague to build a seven-point cushion, then held on as Waiters' last-second attempt bounced away. Towns finished with 20 points and 12 rebounds for Minnesota while Waiters led the Heat with a career-high 33 points and Olynyk chipped in 23.

The Jan. 9 win ended the Wolves' seven-game slide vs. Dallas and was their first Target Center victory over the Mavericks since Nov. 8, 2013.

First Meeting: Karl-Anthony Towns scored 34 points with 11 rebounds to help the Timberwolves snap their four-game losing streak with a 101-92 victory over Dallas on Jan. 9 at Target Center. Ricky Rubio finished with 13 points, 15 assists and five steals for Minnesota while Harrison Barnes led the Mavericks with 30 points and Dirk Nowitzki added a season-high 26.

Second Meeting: Wesley Matthews' 19 points led six double-figure scorers as Dallas halted the Timberwolves' three-game winning streak with a 98-87 triumph on Jan. 15 at the American Airlines Center. Dirk Nowitzki tallied 17 points and Deron Williams dealt 10 assists for the Mavericks, while Gorgui Dieng led Minnesota with a season-high 21 points and Andrew Wiggins added 18.

Third Meeting: Andrew Wiggins tallied 27 points and Karl-Anthony Towns contributed 26 with 18 rebounds to lift the Timberwolves past Dallas, 97-84, on Feb. 24 at Target Center. Ricky Rubio finished with 13 points, 14 assists and three steals for Minnesota while Seth Curry led the Mavericks with a career-high 31 points and Harrison Barnes tacked on 20.

ROSTER NOTES: On Oct. 16, Minnesota announced its 15-man Opening Night roster, having reached the limit by waiving forwards Amile Jefferson and Shawne Williams and guard Melo Trimble on Oct. 14... Of the 15 players who finished 2016-17 on the Wolves' roster, only seven are back this season... Eight new faces dot Minnesota's roster, highlighted by Jimmy Butler – acquired in a trade with Chicago on June 22 – and free-agent signees Jeff Teague, Taj Gibson and Jamal Crawford... Justin Patton, chosen 16th overall by Chicago in the 2017 Draft and dealt to the Wolves along with Butler, is the sole rookie... Last October, the Wolves returned 10 of 14 players from their final 2015-16 roster; they kept nine of 16 from 2014-15 to 2015-16 and nine of 15 from 2013-14 to 2014-15... The current 15-player roster averages 5.0 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 27.1 years; the 2016-17 Opening Night group was at 3.6 and 26.1 years, respectively (5.1 and 27.6 in 2015-16, 4.0 and 25.6 in 2014-15)... Shabazz Muhammad and Gorgui Dieng are now atop the team's seniority list, starting their fifth seasons in Minnesota, while Andrew Wiggins enters year number four...

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota capped a 2-0 road swing and extended its winning streak to three by holding off New Orleans, 104-98, on Wednesday, [moving atop the Northwest Division at 5-3...](#) The Wolves' most recent in-season four-game winning streak occurred nearly five years ago (Dec. 7-15, 2012)... The Wolves boosted their record to 4-0 in one-possession games with Monday's 125-122 OT win at Miami; dating to the 104-101 win at the Clippers on Jan. 19, 2017, [Minnesota is 11-3 in its past 14 games to be decided by three points or fewer...](#) The Wolves beat Oklahoma City for the second time in six nights with the 119-116 decision on Oct. 27 at Target Center... The win improves Minnesota's record to 3-0 vs. Northwest opponents; they haven't put together a winning record vs. Northwest rivals since going 10-6 in 2004-05... Minnesota shot 11-for-23 from long distance in Monday's win at Miami, its second game with 10+ treys this year (10 at Oklahoma City, Oct. 22)... [A year ago, the Wolves went 17-5 when outscoring their foes from beyond the arc;](#) they've connected on 68 three-pointers thus far, three shy of last year's haul (71) for the most prolific eight-game start in club history...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The Wolves finished at 49.4% from the floor on Wednesday while limiting New Orleans to 42.9% – their best defensive percentage of the season and just the second time in eight starts they've outshot the opposition... Entering the contest, Minnesota had allowed 50%+ accuracy in each of its four previous games, equaling the 5th longest such streak in club history; teams shot a combined 55.2% (196-for-355) in those four... [The run began when Indiana shot a franchise-record 66.7% \(56-for-84\) on Oct. 24 at Target Center,](#) tying the top percentage ever by a Wolves opponent as well as the 8th-highest figure by any NBA team in the past quarter-century... Minnesota's single-game high to date is 50.0%, set in the Oct. 22 victory at Oklahoma City; the Wolves rank 7th in FG accuracy (46.7%) and 8th in scoring (108.8 ppg), but last in defensive FG pct (50.8%) and 28th in scoring defense (113.1 ppg)...

THE BOARD REPORT: Miami piled up a 50-40 rebounding advantage on Monday, the Wolves' third double-figure deficit of the year... Last season, Minnesota was outboarded by 10+ on six occasions, topped by a 53-34 deficit vs. Oklahoma City on Apr. 11... [Monday's victory was only the Wolves' 10th in their last 120 games when being outrebounded by a double-digit margin](#) – dating to April 2007 – and first since overcoming a 51-33 spread to beat Memphis 114-108 on Mar. 16, 2016 at FedExForum... Detroit posted a 47-37 edge on Oct. 25, one night after Indiana's 42-27 margin at Target Center; the 27 rebounds vs. Indiana tie the Wolves' single-game low since facing a 47-26 deficit at Cleveland on Mar. 27, 2009... [For the season, Minnesota is 4-0 with the rebounding advantage,](#) most recently notching a season-best 47-38 edge Wednesday at New Orleans... The Wolves rank 17th in the NBA in total rebounding pct (.498), 7th in offensive rebounding pct (.251), 28th in defensive rebounding pct (.744) and 30th in fast break points allowed (16.9 ppg)...

NEW DIGS: Oct. 25 was the Wolves' first-ever visit to Little Caesars Arena in Detroit, the 65th different venue in which they've played a regular-season game... Minnesota's most recent arena christening was last Oct. 29 at the Golden 1 Center in Sacramento, a game the Kings won 106-103... The Wolves reopened Target Center with the 100-97 triumph over Utah on Oct. 20, improving to 20-9 all-time in home openers – highlighted by 19 wins in their past 23 in that category... The Wolves begin 2017-18 by playing eight of their first 13 contests on the road, ending with the Nov. 13 trip to Utah... [Tonight's game vs. Dallas continues a four-week run that sees Minnesota play 11 of 14 games against teams that missed the 2017 Playoffs...](#) Tonight also kicks off the second of 15 back-to-back sets for the Wolves this year; they played 15 pairs of back-to-back games a year ago, going 4-11 on the front end and 5-10 on the tail end...

DOUBLE OR NOTHING: Detroit registered a 122-101 win on Oct. 25, its fifth consecutive victory over the Wolves and squaring the all-time series at 28-28... The Pistons' 122 points are their 2nd-highest total ever vs. Minnesota (126-112 on Nov. 8, 1994 at The Palace); they're averaging 117.5 ppg in the teams' past four meetings... Meanwhile, Indiana ran its Target Center winning streak to four games with the 130-107 decision on Oct. 24, the Wolves' biggest home setback since Detroit notched a 117-90 victory last Dec. 9; overall, they suffered five 20+ defeats a year ago... [The losses at Detroit and vs. Indiana are the first time Minnesota has suffered consecutive 20+ point defeats since Mar. 29-30, 2015...](#) The Wolves picked up a 115-113 triumph on Oct. 22 at Oklahoma City, two nights after holding off Utah 100-97 at Target Center... The win was just Minnesota's third road success in 18 tries since the Thunder moved from Seattle in 2008; they've split their past six overall vs. Oklahoma City since ending a 10-game drought with a 99-96 win on Mar. 11, 2016...

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished 2016-17 with a 31-51 record, a two-game improvement from a year ago and 15 wins better than 2014-15... That's the largest two-year increase in the NBA this season, ahead of New York (+14), Boston (+13) and Utah (+13), as well as the 3rd-best full-season two-year bump in franchise history (+19 from 1994-95 to 1996-97, +19 from 1995-96 to 1997-98)... The final record is the sixth time in seven seasons Minnesota has improved on its previous year's victory total... The Wolves have now missed the postseason in 13 straight years, after advancing to the playoffs every season from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought – Sacramento (11) and Phoenix (seven) are next on that list – and is the 2nd-longest in NBA history behind the Clippers franchise's 15-year siesta from 1976-77 through 1990-91 while drifting from Buffalo to San Diego to Los Angeles... Minnesota opened the season with six victories in its first 24 games (through Dec. 11), then fashioned a 22-20 record over the next three months – highlighted by home wins over Houston, Oklahoma City, Toronto, Golden State and Washington, as well as road successes at Chicago, Atlanta, the L.A. Clippers and Utah – before stumbling to 13 losses in its final 16 contests...

SCHEDULE NOTES: The Wolves finished 20-21 at Target Center, matching their 2nd-best home record in the past decade; Minnesota went 24-17 (and 40-42 overall) in 2013-14, and also won 20 games in 2006-07 and 2012-13... The Wolves put together a pair of four-game home winning streaks – Jan. 9-22 and Feb. 24-Mar. 13 – that bookended a nine-week spree that saw them win 12 of 17 at Target Center following a 6-13 start... Minnesota won consecutive road games on only three occasions: Dec. 13-21, Jan. 19-24 and Feb. 27-Mar. 1... The latter pair fueled a stretch that saw the Wolves win five of eight away from Target Center and was capped by the 107-80 triumph at Utah on Mar. 1... However, Minnesota managed just one victory in its final 13 road starts, a 115-114 decision Mar. 28 at Indiana that snapped a seven-game skid... The Wolves played 15 sets of back-to-back games this season, going 4-11 on the front end and 5-10 in the second games of such pairings... Minnesota went 6-4 vs. Southeast Division opponents, its best such record since the NBA realigned divisions in 2004-05... Meanwhile, the Wolves lost all nine road games against Southwest Division foes and are 2-21 in Southwest arenas (winning Feb. 27, 2016 at New Orleans and Mar. 16, 2016 at Memphis) over the past three seasons...

MARGINAL NOTES: The 110-109 loss Apr. 9 at the L.A. Lakers was Minnesota's first in a one-point decision since November 2014, ending its NBA-record-tying string of 10 consecutive wins in such games... The 107-80 triumph at Utah on Mar. 1 was the Wolves' sixth by 20+ points this season; they registered only two such victories a year ago and one in 2014-15... The 27-point Utah decision also tied the 7th-largest road win in team history... Feb. 8 vs. Toronto was the lone time this season the Wolves erased a double-figure halftime spread to win; Minnesota faced only seven such deficits overall, the fewest in the NBA (Golden State 8, Houston 8, San Antonio 9)... Meanwhile, the 125-97 loss at Cleveland on Feb. 1 was Minnesota's biggest losing margin since San Antonio beat them 121-92 on Nov. 21, 2014 at Target Center... The 112-111 victory Jan. 24 at Phoenix was the Wolves' third in as many outings in games decided by four points or fewer; they beat Denver 111-108 on Jan. 22, two nights after edging the L.A. Clippers 104-101 to halt an 0-10 start in that category, and finished the year 7-12 overall... Portland erased a 15-point, 3rd-quarter deficit to win, 105-98, on Apr. 6; the Wolves lost 11 games in which they'd built leads of 15+ points, the NBA's most such defeats in the past two decades...

LOCKED IN: Minnesota tallied a season-high 130 points Feb. 25 at Houston, its second-best regulation total ever in a road game (132 at Denver, Mar. 3, 2014)... In all, the Wolves cracked the Century Mark 58 times this year, one shy of the club single-season record of 59 set in 2013-14... Minnesota ranked 13th in the NBA in scoring (105.6 ppg) – the second-highest average in club history (106.9 ppg in 2013-14) – while setting franchise records in FG accuracy (46.7%, 8th in the NBA) and FT accuracy (79.9%, 5th in the NBA)... The Wolves also broke their previous single-season mark for three-pointers made (600 in 2013-14) by sinking 601, finishing the year 20th in long-distance accuracy at 34.9%, and set new records for Effective FG Percentage (51.1%) and True Shooting Percentage (55.5%)... Minnesota shot a season-best 56.3% vs. Dallas on Jan. 9, eclipsing the 55.8% showing in the Dec. 30 win vs. Milwaukee; they're 86-13 all-time when shooting 55% or better... The Wolves finished 15-for-31 from beyond the arc in the Dec. 26 win vs. Atlanta, the fifth time in club history they've made 15+ threes (second this season) and one of 16 times this season they made 10+ threes...

AT THE OTHER END: The Wolves closed the season by permitting 100+ points in each of their final 19 contests (Mar. 10-Apr. 12), the second-longest such streak in franchise history behind a 24-game run in 1991-92... For the year, Minnesota ranked 18th in scoring defense (106.7 ppg), 28th in defensive FG percentage (47.5%) and 26th in Defensive Rating (109.1); those numbers were 23rd (106.0 ppg), 28th (47.1%) and 27th (107.1), respectively, in 2015-16... In dropping 13 of their final 16 games, the Wolves surrendered 114.6 ppg (a Defensive Rating of 117.1) and a combined 51.2% accuracy from the floor... Utah finished at 60.0% on Apr. 7, the third 60%+ effort allowed by the Wolves this season; Portland shot 63.4% on Mar. 25 (the 4th-highest percentage ever by a Minnesota opponent) while New Orleans shot 60.0% on Feb. 10... The Wolves held Utah to 38.9% on Mar. 1, their sixth sub-40% defensive effort in 2016-17; the Jazz' 80 points matched the fewest allowed by Minnesota this year (also Nov. 1 vs. Memphis)... Houston erupted for 142 points on Feb. 25; the combined 272 points represent the highest-scoring regulation game in franchise history... The Rockets finished 22-for-58 from beyond the arc in that game, the most three-point makes and attempts ever by a Wolves opponent...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded seven of its eight April opponents, after coming up short in six of its final seven March starts... Overall, the Wolves ranked 5th in the NBA in total rebounding pct (.516, the third-best percentage in franchise history), 3rd in offensive rebounding pct (.272), 20th in defensive rebounding pct (.759) and 7th in rebounding margin (+2.0 rpg)... Minnesota also finished 6th in second-chance scoring (14.8 ppg) and 9th in paint scoring (45.7 ppg), up from 12th (13.0 ppg) and 10th (44.1 ppg) in those respective categories a year ago... Oklahoma City outrebounded Minnesota 54-35 on Apr. 11, the largest of six double-figure deficits for the Wolves on the year; Minnesota enjoyed spreads of 10+ on 10 occasions, most recently posting a 50-40 advantage Apr. 4 at Golden State... The Wolves outrebounded Houston 58-32 on Feb. 25; the 21 offensive and 58 total rebounds were season bests, while the +26 margin is the 3rd-largest in franchise history... Minnesota outboarded Dallas 42-25 on Jan. 9; the Mavs' 25 rebounds are the fewest by an opponent at Target Center since Houston totaled 23 on Feb. 21, 1996...

Named president of basketball operations and head coach on Apr. 20, 2016, becoming the 14th coach in team history... It's his second stint with the Timberwolves, having served as an assistant on Bill Musselman's staff in 1989-90 and 1990-91... Most recently spent five seasons (2010-11 through 2014-15) as the head coach in Chicago, *where he was named the NBA's Coach of the Year in 2010-11 after guiding the Bulls to a 62-20 record* and a trip to the Eastern Conference Finals in his first year on the bench... Followed up by directing Chicago to a 50-16 finish in 2011-12, again winning the Central Division while placing 2nd to Gregg Popovich in the Coach of the Year balloting... The Bulls qualified for the NBA Playoffs in all five seasons under his direction, reaching the Eastern Conference Semifinals in both 2012-13 and 2014-15, after advancing past the first round just once in the 12 years prior to his arrival... His winning percentage (.647) ranks 2nd all-time among Chicago coaches behind Phil Jackson (.738), while his 255 wins are good for 3rd behind Jackson (545) and Dick Motta (356)... In addition to Minnesota, has also served as an assistant with San Antonio (1992-94), Philadelphia (1994-96), New York (1996-2003), Houston (2003-07) and Boston (2007-10)... Chosen by USA Basketball as an assistant coach for the Men's National Team on June 10, 2013, and was part of the staff that won gold medals at the 2014 FIBA Basketball World Cup in Barcelona, Spain, and the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil... A 1981 graduate of Salem (Mass.) State, he began his coaching career at his alma mater the following season and ascended to the head coaching position in 1984-85, then spent the next four years as an assistant at Harvard prior to his entry into the NBA coaching ranks...
