Last Game: Friday, Nov. 24 – Miami 109, Minnesota 97

Wayne Ellington came off the bench to score a game-high 21 points, hitting six of Miami's season-best 19 treys in a 109-97 win over the Timberwolves on Friday night at Target Center. The Heat sank 10 of their first 13 shots to open a 25-11 lead. Minnesota responded with the game's next 13 points, drawing to within one on Andrew Wiggins' steal and layup, before Ellington hit a 3-pointer to make it 28-24 after one quarter. Miami rebuilt its lead to 13 midway through the second before settling for a 58-48 halftime edge on Goran Dragic's late jumper, and three straight Dion Waiters baskets helped the Heat fend off a third-quarter surge that had pulled Minnesota to within 73-66. Miami carried an 11-point lead into the fourth and Kelly Olynyk's 3-pointer stretched the margin to 86-70 a minute into the period. Ellington's final long-range strike gave Miami its largest lead of the night at 105-85 with 4:58 left before Karl-Anthony Towns sparked a late push that whittled the final deficit to 12. Dragic finished with 20 points and Hassan Whiteside had 10 rebounds for the Heat while Minnesota received 18 points apiece from Towns, Wiggins and Jimmy Butler.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Nov. 22 – Minnesota 124, Orlando 118

Jimmy Butler's 26 points led a franchise-record-tying four 20-point scorers and the Timberwolves withstood Orlando's fourth-quarter blitz to eke out a 124-118 win on Wednesday night at Target Center. Consecutive Marresse Speights treys helped the Magic grab a 35-30 lead after one period, and the margin crested at eight on Arron Afflalo's 3-pointer midway through the second. However, Butler sparked a 12-5 finish to the half that put Minnesota on top 65-62 and Andrew Wiggins capped a 21-9 start to the third quarter that pushed the Wolves' lead to 15. After D.J. Augustin pulled Orlando to within 12 at the 3:09 mark, Minnesota reeled off the final 14 points of the period and grabbed its largest lead when Jamal Crawford's three-point play with 4.4 seconds left made it 106-80. The Wolves missed their first 14 shots of the fourth before Butler's trey broke the drought with 5:05 to play, ending a 19-1 rally, but Orlando climbed to within 121-116 in the final moments before faltering. Taj Gibson tallied 24 points and Jeff Teague had 22 with 11 assists for Minnesota, while Aaron Gordon led the Magic with 26 points and Terrence Ross added 22.

ROSTER NOTES: On Oct. 16, Minnesota announced its 15-man Opening Night roster, having reached the limit by waiving forwards Amile Jefferson and Shawne Williams and guard Melo Trimble on Oct. 14... Of the 15 players who finished 2016-17 on the Wolves' roster, only seven are back this season... Eight new faces dot Minnesota's roster, highlighted by Jimmy Butler – acquired in a trade with Chicago on June 22 – and free-agent signees Jeff Teague, Taj Gibson and Jamal Crawford... Justin Patton, chosen 16th overall by Chicago in the 2017 Draft and dealt to the Wolves along with Butler, is the sole rookie... Last October, the Wolves returned 10 of 14 players from their final 2015-16 roster; they kept nine of 16 from 2014-15 to 2015-16 and nine of 15 from 2013-14 to 2014-15... The current 15-player roster averages 5.0 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 27.1 years; the 2016-17 Opening Night group was at 3.6 and 26.1 years, respectively (5.1 and 27.6 in 2015-16, 4.0 and 25.6 in 2014-15)... Shabazz Muhammad and Gorgui Dieng are now atop the team's seniority list, starting their fifth seasons in Minnesota, while Andrew Wiggins enters year number four...

WOLF TRACKS: Miami sent the Wolves to their third loss in four games with Friday's 109-97 decision at Target Center, earning a split of the two-game season set after Minnesota had won 125-122 in OT on Oct. 30... Despite the loss, the Wolves (11-8) remain tied atop the Northwest Division with Denver and Portland; a victory this afternoon would give Minnesota its best 20-game start since 2005-06... The Wolves kicked off their current four-game homestand with Wednesday's 124-118 win over Orlando; they've now beaten the Magic three straight times after dropping 13 of the previous 15... Charlotte dealt Minnesota its second loss in as many nights with the 118-102 decision on Nov. 20, avenging the Wolves' 112-94 victory on Nov. 5 at Target Center... Detroit halted Minnesota's three-game winning streak by claiming a 100-97 win on Nov. 19; they've beaten the Wolves six straight times overall, including a 122-101 verdict on Oct. 25 at Little Caesars Arena... Minnesota ended a five-game drought at the American Airlines Center with the 111-87 win at Dallas on Nov. 17, and halted a 12-game series skid overall vs. San Antonio by winning 98-86 at a sold-out Target Center on Nov. 15; the latter was their first triumph over the Spurs since Apr. 8, 2014... Minnesota salvaged the finale of its three-game Western swing by downing Utah 109-98 on Nov. 13... The Wolves began the trip with a 125-101 loss at Golden State on Nov. 8, a decision that snapped Minnesota's first five-game winning streak in nearly nine years (Jan. 2-10, 2009) and halted a five-game run of success vs. Western rivals...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Friday's 12-point loss to Miami dropped the Wolves to 5-5 on the season in games decided by 10+ points (3-2 at Target Center)... Five of Minnesota's past six wins (starting Nov. 4 vs. Dallas) have been by double-digit spreads; their first five were by a total of 17 points... The 125-101 setback on Nov. 8 was the Wolves' largest vs. Golden State since Nov. 9, 2009 in Oakland (146-105)... Detroit notched a 122-101 victory on Oct. 25; meanwhile, Indiana ran its Target Center winning streak to four with the 130-107 decision on Oct. 24, the Wolves' biggest home loss since Detroit won 117-90 last Dec. 9; they incurred five 20+ defeats a year ago... The Wolves posted a 115-113 triumph on Oct. 22 at Oklahoma City (two nights after holding off Utah 100-97 at Target Center)...

THE BOARD REPORT: Charlotte piled up a 52-38 margin on Nov. 20, the Wolves' fourth double-figure deficit of the season... A year ago, Minnesota was outboarded by 10+ six times, topped by a 53-34 deficit vs. Oklahoma City on Apr. 11... Indiana racked up a 42-27 spread on Oct. 24; the 27 rebounds tie the Wolves' single-game low since facing a 47-26 deficit at Cleveland on Mar. 27, 2009... The Wolves outrebounded Charlotte 54-40 on Nov. 5, their second straight double-figure spread; they're 8-2 with the board advantage... Minnesota posted a 10+ edge 11 times in 2016-17, going 7-4 in those... The Wolves are 10th in the NBA in total rebounding pct (.509), 7th in offensive rebounding pct (.248), 16th in defensive rebounding pct (.771) and 5th in second-chance points (14.1 ppg)...

THE BIG 80s: Minnesota outscored Dallas 68-32 in the 2nd half on Nov. 17, holding the Mavericks to 87 points (37.2%) for the night... The 36-point spread is the largest differential for any half in club history; the Wolves outscored San Antonio by 33 in the 2nd half on Feb. 23, 2002... The Spurs' 86 points on Nov. 15 are the fewest allowed by Minnesota to date; they've held six of 12 November foes under 100 (allowing 104.2 ppg on 46.5%) after permitting 100+ in six of seven October starts (115.3 ppg on 51.9%)... Minnesota shot 54.4% Nov. 4 vs. Dallas, its best percentage since hitting 56.3% vs. the Mavs last Jan. 9... The Wolves shot 51.3% Nov. 19 vs. Detroit; they rank 7th in Offensive Rating (107.1), 11th in scoring (107.5 ppg), 12th in FG accuracy (46.2%) and 17th in three-point accuracy (36.0%)... Minnesota went 13-for-30 from long range in the Nov. 17 win at Dallas; they're 6-0 this season when hitting 10+ threes...

HOME IMPROVEMENT: Wednesday's win over Orlando hiked the Wolves' Target Center record to 6-2, tying the 3rd-best eight-game home start in franchise history; they opened 7-1 in both 1998-99 and 2001-02... The Nov. 19 loss to Detroit ended a run of four straight Target Center victories; the last time they enjoyed a five-game home winning streak was five years ago (Nov. 30-Dec. 20, 2012)... The Wolves completed a 2-0 homestand by beating Charlotte, 112-94, on Nov. 5; the 18-point spread is its largest at home this season, eclipsing the 112-99 win vs. Dallas one night earlier... Minnesota beat Oklahoma City for the second time in six nights with the 119-116 verdict on Oct. 27 at Target Center; the Wolves are now 4-0 vs. Northwest rivals, having finished 5-11 within the division in 2016-17...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Friday's loss to Miami ended a string of four in a row vs. Eastern foes for Minnesota (3-5 overall vs. the East); beginning Wednesday at New Orleans, they'll play 13 of the next 14 vs. Western rivals... The Wolves opened 2017-18 by playing 10 of their first 17 games on the road; they're now in a four-week stretch of playing 10 of 14 at Target Center – including homestands of four (Nov. 22-28) and five (Dec. 10-18) games in length... Oct. 25 was the Wolves' first-ever visit to Little Caesars Arena in Detroit, the 65th different venue in which they've played a regular-season game... Minnesota reopened Target Center with the 100-97 triumph over Utah on Oct. 20, improving to 20-9 all-time in home openers... The Nov. 20 loss at Charlotte wrapped up the third of 15 back-to-back sets for the Wolves this year; they played 15 pairs of back-to-back games a year ago, going 4-11 on the front end and 5-10 on the tail end...

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished 2016-17 with a 31-51 record, a two-game improvement from a year ago and 15 wins better than 2014-15... That's the largest two-year increase in the NBA this season, ahead of New York (+14), Boston (+13) and Utah (+13), as well as the 3rd-best full-season two-year bump in franchise history (+19 from 1994-95 to 1996-97, +19 from 1995-96 to 1997-98)... The final record is the sixth time in seven seasons Minnesota has improved on its previous year's victory total... The Wolves have now missed the postseason in 13 straight years, after advancing to the playoffs every season from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought – Sacramento (11) and Phoenix (seven) are next on that list – and is the 2nd-longest in NBA history behind the Clippers franchise's 15-year siesta from 1976-77 through 1990-91 while drifting from Buffalo to San Diego to Los Angeles... Minnesota opened the season with six victories in its first 24 games (through Dec. 11), then fashioned a 22-20 record over the next three months – highlighted by home wins over Houston, Oklahoma City, Toronto, Golden State and Washington, as well as road successes at Chicago, Atlanta, the L.A. Clippers and Utah – before stumbling to 13 losses in its final 16 contests...

SCHEDULE NOTES: The Wolves finished 20-21 at Target Center, matching their 2nd-best home record in the past decade; Minnesota went 24-17 (and 40-42 overall) in 2013-14, and also won 20 games in 2006-07 and 2012-13... The Wolves put together a pair of four-game home winning streaks – Jan. 9-22 and Feb. 24-Mar. 13 – that bookended a nine-week spree that saw them win 12 of 17 at Target Center following a 6-13 start... Minnesota won consecutive road games on only three occasions: Dec. 13-21, Jan. 19-24 and Feb. 27-Mar. 1... The latter pair fueled a stretch that saw the Wolves win five of eight away from Target Center and was capped by the 107-80 triumph at Utah on Mar. 1... However, Minnesota managed just one victory in its final 13 road starts, a 115-114 decision Mar. 28 at Indiana that snapped a seven-game skid... The Wolves played 15 sets of back-to-back games this season, going 4-11 on the front end and 5-10 in the second games of such pairings... Minnesota went 6-4 vs. Southeast Division opponents, its best such record since the NBA realigned divisions in 2004-05... Meanwhile, the Wolves lost all nine road games against Southwest Division foes and are 2-21 in Southwest arenas (winning Feb. 27, 2016 at New Orleans and Mar. 16, 2016 at Memphis) over the past three seasons...

MARGINAL NOTES: The 110-109 loss Apr. 9 at the L.A. Lakers was Minnesota's first in a one-point decision since November 2014, ending its NBA-record-tying string of 10 consecutive wins in such games... The 107-80 triumph at Utah on Mar. 1 was the Wolves' sixth by 20+ points this season; they registered only two such victories a year ago and one in 2014-15... The 27-point Utah decision also tied the 7th-largest road win in team history... Feb. 8 vs. Toronto was the lone time this season the Wolves erased a double-figure halftime spread to win; Minnesota faced only seven such deficits overall, the fewest in the NBA (Golden State 8, Houston 8, San Antonio 9)... Meanwhile, the 125-97 loss at Cleveland on Feb. 1 was Minnesota's biggest losing margin since San Antonio beat them 121-92 on Nov. 21, 2014 at Target Center... The 112-111 victory Jan. 24 at Phoenix was the Wolves' third in as many outings in games decided by four points or fewer; they beat Denver 111-108 on Jan. 22, two nights after edging the L.A. Clippers 104-101 to halt an 0-10 start in that category, and finished the year 7-12 overall... Portland erased a 15-point, 3rd-quarter deficit to win, 105-98, on Apr. 6; the Wolves lost 11 games in which they'd built leads of 15+ points, the NBA's most such defeats in the past two decades...

LOCKED IN: Minnesota tallied a season-high 130 points Feb. 25 at Houston, its second-best regulation total ever in a road game (132 at Denver, Mar. 3, 2014)... In all, the Wolves cracked the Century Mark 58 times this year, one shy of the club single-season record of 59 set in 2013-14... Minnesota ranked 13th in the NBA in scoring (105.6 ppg) – the second-highest average in club history (106.9 ppg in 2013-14) – while setting franchise records in FG accuracy (46.7%, 8th in the NBA) and FT accuracy (79.9%, 5th in the NBA)... The Wolves also broke their previous single-season mark for three-pointers made (600 in 2013-14) by sinking 601, finishing the year 20th in long-distance accuracy at 34.9%, and set new records for Effective FG Percentage (51.1%) and True Shooting Percentage (55.5%)... Minnesota shot a season-best 56.3% vs. Dallas on Jan. 9, eclipsing the 55.8% showing in the Dec. 30 win vs. Milwaukee; they're 86-13 all-time when shooting 55% or better... The Wolves finished 15-for-31 from beyond the arc in the Dec. 26 win vs. Atlanta, the fifth time in club history they've made 15+ threes (second this season) and one of 16 times this season they made 10+ threes...

AT THE OTHER END: The Wolves closed the season by permitting 100+ points in each of their final 19 contests (Mar. 10-Apr. 12), the second-longest such streak in franchise history behind a 24-game run in 1991-92... For the year, Minnesota ranked 18th in scoring defense (106.7 ppg), 28th in defensive FG percentage (47.5%) and 26th in Defensive Rating (109.1); those numbers were 23rd (106.0 ppg), 28th (47.1%) and 27th (107.1), respectively, in 2015-16... In dropping 13 of their final 16 games, the Wolves surrendered 114.6 ppg (a Defensive Rating of 117.1) and a combined 51.2% accuracy from the floor... Utah finished at 60.0% on Apr. 7, the third 60%+ effort allowed by the Wolves this season; Portland shot 63.4% on Mar. 25 (the 4th-highest percentage ever by a Minnesota opponent) while New Orleans shot 60.0% on Feb. 10... The Wolves held Utah to 38.9% on Mar. 1, their sixth sub-40% defensive effort in 2016-17; the Jazz' 80 points matched the fewest allowed by Minnesota this year (also Nov. 1 vs. Memphis)... Houston erupted for 142 points on Feb. 25; the combined 272 points represent the highest-scoring regulation game in franchise history... The Rockets finished 22-for-58 from beyond the arc in that game, the most three-point makes and attempts ever by a Wolves opponent...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded seven of its eight April opponents, after coming up short in six of its final seven March starts... Overall, the Wolves ranked 5th in the NBA in total rebounding pct (.516, the third-best percentage in franchise history), 3rd in offensive rebounding pct (.272), 20th in defensive rebounding pct (.759) and 7th in rebounding margin (+2.0 rpg)... Minnesota also finished 6th in second-chance scoring (14.8 ppg) and 9th in paint scoring (45.7 ppg), up from 12th (13.0 ppg) and 10th (44.1 ppg) in those respective categories a year ago... Oklahoma City outrebounded Minnesota 54-35 on Apr. 11, the largest of six double-figure deficits for the Wolves on the year; Minnesota enjoyed spreads of 10+ on 10 occasions, most recently posting a 50-40 advantage Apr. 4 at Golden State... The Wolves outrebounded Houston 58-32 on Feb. 25; the 21 offensive and 58 total rebounds were season bests, while the +26 margin is the 3rd-largest in franchise history... Minnesota outboarded Dallas 42-25 on Jan. 9; the Mavs' 25 rebounds are the fewest by an opponent at Target Center since Houston totaled 23 on Feb. 21, 1996...

Most recently spent five seasons (2010-11 through 2014-15) as the head coach in Chicago, *where he was named the NBA's Coach of the Year in 2010-11 after guiding the Bulls to a 62-20 record* and a trip to the Eastern Conference Finals in his first year on the bench... Followed up by directing Chicago to a 50-16 finish in 2011-12, again winning the Central Division while placing 2nd to Gregg Popovich in the Coach of the Year balloting... The Bulls qualified for the NBA Playoffs in all five seasons under his direction, reaching the Eastern Conference Semifinals in both 2012-13 and 2014-15, after advancing past the first round just once in the 12 years prior to his arrival... In addition to Minnesota, has also served as an assistant with San Antonio (1992-94), Philadelphia (1994-96), New York (1996-2003), Houston (2003-07) and Boston (2007-10)...
