Jimmy Butler tallied 37 points, including the deciding free throws with 2.5 seconds left, and Jamal Crawford scored 16 of his season-high 23 points in the fourth quarter as the Timberwolves rallied for a 108-107 victory over Portland on Monday night at Target Center. CJ McCollum fueled a 12-2 second-period burst that put the Blazers in front 36-29, but Karl-Anthony Towns and Butler combined on the next eight as Minnesota edged ahead. A late 3-pointer from Damian Lillard sent Portland into halftime holding a 54-51 lead, and the third quarter stayed close until Ed Davis' tip-in completed a 9-2 finish that rebuilt the Blazers' margin to 85-76. The Blazers took their largest lead when Zach Collins made it 97-87 with 7:28 remaining, only to see Crawford respond with a trey to ignite a string of eight unanswered for the Wolves. Butler put Minnesota on top at the 1:00 mark but McCollum's jumper 16 seconds later reclaimed a 107-106 lead, setting the stage for Butler's winning free throws. Towns had 16 points and eight rebounds for Minnesota. McCollum and Jusuf Nurkic led the Blazers with 20 points apiece while Lillard added 17 points and 13 assists.

Previous Game: Saturday, Dec. 16 – Phoenix 108, Minnesota 106

Isaiah Canaan sank three free throws with 6.1 seconds remaining as Phoenix overcame a 15-point deficit to beat the Timberwolves, 108-106, on Saturday night at Target Center. Jimmy Butler's steal and layup capped a 19-6 start for Minnesota, but the Suns whittled the gap to 25-22 by the end of the first quarter and were within two following a Josh Jackson basket midway through the second. Taj Gibson keyed a 15-2 counter that gave the Wolves their largest lead at 50-35 with 1:47 left before halftime. Alex Len pulled Phoenix to within eight at the break, only to see Minnesota use seven consecutive points from Karl-Anthony Towns to rebuild the margin to 65-52. However, the Suns scored on their final five possessions of the third quarter to get within 81-77 and Len's tip-in gave Phoenix its first lead of the night at 92-91 with 7:51 to play. The Suns led by as many as five before Butler reclaimed the upper hand for the Wolves at 106-105, setting the stage for Canaan's decisive free throws. Dragan Bender and Troy Daniels tallied 17 points apiece for the Suns while Len pulled down 19 rebounds. Towns led Minnesota with 28 points and 11 rebounds.

First Meeting: Danilo Gallinari and Jusuf Nurkic combined for 18 points in the pivotal third quarter as Denver rallied to defeat the Timberwolves, 102-99, on Nov. 3 at Target Center. Karl-Anthony Towns collected 32 points and 14 rebounds for Minnesota and Andrew Wiggins put in 25 points.

Second Meeting: Danilo Gallinari hit the tie-breaking jumper with 27 seconds left as Denver rallied for a 105-103 victory on Dec. 28 at the Pepsi Center. Andrew Wiggins' 25 points topped Minnesota while Karl-Anthony Towns posted his first career triple-double (15 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists).

Third Meeting: Karl-Anthony Towns collected 32 points, including the tie-breaking jumper with 42.5 seconds remaining, and the Timberwolves outscored Denver 20-8 over the final 6:00 to pull out a 111-108 win on Jan. 22 at Target Center. Andrew Wiggins had 24 points and Shabazz Muhammad added 20 for Minnesota while Gary Harris led the Nuggets with 22 points.

Fourth Meeting: Andrew Wiggins erupted for 40 points and Karl-Anthony Towns added 24 points and 19 rebounds as the Timberwolves headed into the All-Star Break with a 112-99 win over Denver on Feb. 15 at the Pepsi Center. Gary Harris' 22 points led the Nuggets and Jameer Nelson added 16 points and 11 assists.

ROSTER NOTES: On Oct. 16, Minnesota announced its 15-man Opening Night roster, having reached the limit by waiving forwards Amile Jefferson and Shawne Williams and guard Melo Trimble on Oct. 14... Of the 15 players who finished 2016-17 on the Wolves' roster, only seven are back this season... Eight new faces dot Minnesota's roster, highlighted by Jimmy Butler – acquired in a trade with Chicago on June 22 – and free-agent signees Jeff Teague, Taj Gibson and Jamal Crawford... Justin Patton, chosen 16th overall by Chicago in the 2017 Draft and dealt to the Wolves along with Butler, is the sole rookie... Last October, the Wolves returned 10 of 14 players from their final 2015-16 roster; they kept nine of 16 from 2014-15 to 2015-16 and nine of 15 from 2013-14 to 2014-15... The current 15-player roster averages 5.0 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 27.1 years; the 2016-17 Opening Night group was at 3.6 and 26.1 years, respectively (5.1 and 27.6 in 2015-16, 4.0 and 25.6 in 2014-15)... Shabazz Muhammad and Gorgui Dieng are now atop the team's seniority list, starting their fifth seasons in Minnesota, while Andrew Wiggins enters year number four...

TOWNS IS WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Nov. 20, Wolves center Karl-Anthony Towns was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Nov. 13-19. Towns helped Minnesota post a 3-1 record for the week – including road victories at Utah and Dallas – by averaging 20.3 ppg and 12.3 rpg while shooting 55.4% from the floor and 56.3% (9-for-16) from long range. He collected 24 points and 13 rebounds (sinking a career-high four 3-pointers) in the Nov. 13 triumph at Utah, followed up with 26 points, 16 rebounds and two blocks as Minnesota beat San Antonio on Nov. 15 at a sold-out Target Center, and had 15 points and 11 rebounds in the Nov. 17 win at Dallas. It's the third weekly honor of Towns' career (also Apr. 11, 2016 and Mar. 13, 2017); he's one of eight players in franchise history to win the award, joining Kevin Garnett (15 times), Kevin Love (twice), Al Jefferson (twice), Stephon Marbury (Feb. 21, 1999), Sam Cassell (Dec. 28, 2003), Nikola Pekovic (Apr. 8, 2013) and Mo Williams (Jan. 19, 2015).

DOUBLE-DIPPING: Karl-Anthony Towns tallied 30 points, 14 rebounds, five assists and five blocks in the Dec. 14 win vs. Sacramento, joining Kevin Garnett (twice) as the only players in franchise history – *and becoming just the NBA's ninth player in the past decade* – to register 30+ pts/10+ reb/5+ ast/5+ blk. Monday's game vs. Portland was Towns' 195th in a Wolves uniform; over the last 35 years, only Shaquille O'Neal, Tim Duncan and David Robinson have collected more double-doubles at the same juncture of their careers:

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended its five-game homestand by edging Portland 108-107 on Monday; the teams have split their past six meetings, with the Wolves' three wins all coming by a single point... Minnesota improves to 18-13, matching the 3rd-best 31-game start in club history (22-9 in 2001-02, 21-10 in 2003-04, 18-13 in 1998-99), and moves 1.5 games up on Portland (16-14) and Denver (16-14) atop the Northwest, with Oklahoma City (15-15) 2.5 games behind and Utah (14-17) in 5th place... Meanwhile, the Wolves stand 4th in the Western Conference overall, three games back of San Antonio (21-10)... Minnesota kicked off the just-completed five-game run at home by beating Dallas 97-92 on Dec. 10, its third victory over the Mavericks this season (112-99 on Nov. 4, 111-87 on Nov. 17)... The homestand continued with a 118-112 OT loss to Philadelphia on Dec. 12 (the Sixers' fifth win vs. Minnesota in the last seven meetings) and was followed by a 119-96 triumph over Sacramento on Dec. 14 and a 108-106 loss to Phoenix on Dec. 16...

HOME IMPROVEMENT: Monday's victory boosted the Wolves' Target Center record to 11-6, matching their best 17-game home start since going 12-5 in 2003-04; they broke from the gate with a 15-2 home mark in 2001-02... Minnesota is 9-1 at home (15-6 overall) vs. Western Conference opponents; the Wolves haven't compiled a winning record vs. the West since going 30-22 in 2004-05... Their 15-6 mark represents the top win total in West-only matchups; Houston (14-2, .875) leads in winning percentage... Minnesota finished each of the past two seasons 18-34 vs. Western foes and didn't notch its 15th conference win a year ago until Mar. 8 vs. the L.A. Clippers... Monday's win over Portland also hiked the Wolves' record to 5-1 overall vs. Northwest rivals; they went 5-11 in the division last year... Minnesota capped a 2-2 homestand with the 92-89 loss to Washington on Nov. 28... The stand began with a 124-118 triumph over Orlando (Nov. 22) and continued with a 109-97 loss to Miami (Nov. 24) and a 119-108 win over Phoenix on Nov. 26...

ROAD WORK: The Wolves claimed their second six-point win vs. the L.A. Clippers in four nights with the 113-107 decision on Dec. 6 at Staples Center; Minnesota dealt L.A. a 112-106 setback on Dec. 3 at home... The Wolves are 7-7 away from Target Center, joining Houston (12-1), Golden State (14-3) and Portland (9-6) as the West's only teams with .500+ road records... Minnesota began its prior trip by falling 95-92 at Memphis on Dec. 4, one night after the home win vs. the Clippers... The Wolves ended a two-game trip by losing 111-107 on Dec. 1 at Oklahoma City; the teams' three meetings to date (Minnesota won the first two) have been decided by a total of nine points... Minnesota capped November with the 120-102 win on Nov. 29 at New Orleans, bookending a 104-98 triumph on Nov. 1 at the Smoothie King Center... The Wolves went 9-6 for the month, tying their best win total ever for November (9-4 in 2001-02)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Monday's win over Portland was the Wolves' first game of the season to be decided by one point... Their final such outing a year ago, a 110-109 loss at the L.A. Lakers on Apr. 9, ended an NBA-record-tying string of 10 consecutive victories in one-point decisions that began in November 2014... The 23-point win over Sacramento on Dec. 14 is the Wolves' 2nd-largest this year; they notched a 111-87 win at Dallas on Nov. 17... Each of Minnesota's prior six outings had been decided by six points or fewer, its longest such run since January 2007... Indiana ran its Target Center winning streak to four with the 130-107 victory on Oct. 24 – the Wolves' biggest home loss since Detroit won 117-90 last Dec. 9; they incurred five 20+ defeats a year ago... The Wolves eked out a 115-113 victory on Oct. 22 at Oklahoma City – just their third road success in 19 tries since the Thunder moved from Seattle in 2008...

THE BOARD REPORT: Phoenix piled up a 52-31 rebounding margin on Dec. 16, the Wolves' largest deficit since being outboarded 57-36 at Phoenix on Mar. 14, 2016... It's the 39th time in club history Minnesota has faced a spread of 20+; the only victory in those 39 occurred on Feb. 17, 1992 at Houston (a 57-32 deficit)... The Wolves outrebounded Dallas 45-33 on Dec. 10, their fifth double-digit spread of the season; they're 13-4 with the upper hand overall... Minnesota posted a 10+ edge on 11 occasions in 2016-17 (going 7-4 in those games) while facing double-figure deficits six times... The Wolves rank 10th in the NBA in total rebounding pct (.508) and 5th in offensive rebounding pct (.253) but just 26th in defensive rebounding pct (.762)... They're 3rd in second-chance points (14.7 ppg) and 6th in paint scoring (47.3 ppg), but 21st in paint points allowed (45.4 ppg) and 24th in fast break points allowed (12.8 ppg)...

THE BIG 80s: Washington held the Wolves to a season-low 89 points on Nov. 28; Minnesota has lost its last 33 games when scoring fewer than 90 points, dating to the 88-77 home win vs. New Orleans on Jan. 29, 2014... The Wolves bounced back to shoot a season-high 58.0% in the Nov. 29 win at New Orleans, one of 10 50%+ efforts on the year and their top percentage in a road game since hitting 58.1% at Houston on Jan. 30, 2012... Minnesota outscored Dallas 68-32 in the 2nd half on Nov. 17, holding the Mavericks to 87 points for the night... The 36-point spread is the largest differential for any half in franchise history; the Wolves outscored San Antonio by 33 in the 2nd half on Feb. 23, 2002... Minnesota ranks 5th in Offensive Rating (108.8), 9th in scoring (107.6 ppg) and 8th in FG accuracy (46.9%) but 18th in three-point accuracy (35.7%)... San Antonio's 86 points on Nov. 15 are the fewest allowed by the Wolves to date...

STREAKBUSTERS: Memphis' victory on Dec. 4 was its first since Nov. 7, ending an 11-game drought; the Grizzlies have now halted three double-digit skids by beating Minnesota (also Apr. 3, 1996 and Mar. 18, 1999)... Detroit ended the Wolves' three-game winning streak by claiming a 100-97 decision on Nov. 19... Minnesota halted a five-game slide in Dallas with the 111-87 victory on Nov. 17, and stopped a 12-game series skid overall vs. San Antonio by winning 98-86 at a sold-out Target Center on Nov. 15; the latter was their first triumph over the Spurs since Apr. 8, 2014... Minnesota salvaged the finale of its three-game Western swing by downing Utah 109-98 on Nov. 13... The Wolves began the trip with a 125-101 loss at Golden State on Nov. 8, a decision that snapped Minnesota's first five-game winning streak in nearly nine years (Jan. 2-10, 2009) and halted a five-game run of success vs. Western Conference rivals...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Monday's win over Portland wrapped up a season-high five-game homestand for the Wolves that began Dec. 10 vs. Dallas... Starting tonight, seven of Minnesota's next nine (through Jan. 5 at Boston) will be away from Target Center... The Dec. 4 loss at Memphis concluded the fifth of 15 back-to-back sets for the Wolves; they're 2-3 in the first game of such pairings and 2-3 in the second... Minnesota played 15 pairs of back-to-back games a year ago, going 4-11 on the front end and 5-10 on the tail... The Nov. 28 loss to Washington ended a stretch of playing five of six vs. Eastern Conference opponents for Minnesota (3-7 overall vs. the East this year); the Nov. 29 victory at New Orleans began a four-week run in which 13 of 14 games are vs. Western Conference rivals...

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished 2016-17 with a 31-51 record, a two-game improvement from a year ago and 15 wins better than 2014-15... That's the largest two-year increase in the NBA this season, ahead of New York (+14), Boston (+13) and Utah (+13), as well as the 3rd-best full-season two-year bump in franchise history (+19 from 1994-95 to 1996-97, +19 from 1995-96 to 1997-98)... The final record is the sixth time in seven seasons Minnesota has improved on its previous year's victory total... The Wolves have now missed the postseason in 13 straight years, after advancing to the playoffs every season from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought – Sacramento (11) and Phoenix (seven) are next on that list – and is the 2nd-longest in NBA history behind the Clippers franchise's 15-year siesta from 1976-77 through 1990-91 while drifting from Buffalo to San Diego to Los Angeles... Minnesota opened the season with six victories in its first 24 games (through Dec. 11), then fashioned a 22-20 record over the next three months – highlighted by home wins over Houston, Oklahoma City, Toronto, Golden State and Washington, as well as road successes at Chicago, Atlanta, the L.A. Clippers and Utah – before stumbling to 13 losses in its final 16 contests...

SCHEDULE NOTES: The Wolves finished 20-21 at Target Center, matching their 2nd-best home record in the past decade; Minnesota went 24-17 (and 40-42 overall) in 2013-14, and also won 20 games in 2006-07 and 2012-13... The Wolves put together a pair of four-game home winning streaks – Jan. 9-22 and Feb. 24-Mar. 13 – that bookended a nine-week spree that saw them win 12 of 17 at Target Center following a 6-13 start... Minnesota won consecutive road games on only three occasions: Dec. 13-21, Jan. 19-24 and Feb. 27-Mar. 1... The latter pair fueled a stretch that saw the Wolves win five of eight away from Target Center and was capped by the 107-80 triumph at Utah on Mar. 1... However, Minnesota managed just one victory in its final 13 road starts, a 115-114 decision Mar. 28 at Indiana that snapped a seven-game skid... The Wolves played 15 sets of back-to-back games this season, going 4-11 on the front end and 5-10 in the second games of such pairings... Minnesota went 6-4 vs. Southeast Division opponents, its best such record since the NBA realigned divisions in 2004-05... Meanwhile, the Wolves lost all nine road games against Southwest Division foes and are 2-21 in Southwest arenas (winning Feb. 27, 2016 at New Orleans and Mar. 16, 2016 at Memphis) over the past three seasons...

MARGINAL NOTES: The 110-109 loss Apr. 9 at the L.A. Lakers was Minnesota's first in a one-point decision since November 2014, ending its NBA-record-tying string of 10 consecutive wins in such games... The 107-80 triumph at Utah on Mar. 1 was the Wolves' sixth by 20+ points this season; they registered only two such victories a year ago and one in 2014-15... The 27-point Utah decision also tied the 7th-largest road win in team history... Feb. 8 vs. Toronto was the lone time this season the Wolves erased a double-figure halftime spread to win; Minnesota faced only seven such deficits overall, the fewest in the NBA (Golden State 8, Houston 8, San Antonio 9)... Meanwhile, the 125-97 loss at Cleveland on Feb. 1 was Minnesota's biggest losing margin since San Antonio beat them 121-92 on Nov. 21, 2014 at Target Center... The 112-111 victory Jan. 24 at Phoenix was the Wolves' third in as many outings in games decided by four points or fewer; they beat Denver 111-108 on Jan. 22, two nights after edging the L.A. Clippers 104-101 to halt an 0-10 start in that category, and finished the year 7-12 overall... Portland erased a 15-point, 3rd-quarter deficit to win, 105-98, on Apr. 6; the Wolves lost 11 games in which they'd built leads of 15+ points, the NBA's most such defeats in the past two decades...

LOCKED IN: Minnesota tallied a season-high 130 points Feb. 25 at Houston, its second-best regulation total ever in a road game (132 at Denver, Mar. 3, 2014)... In all, the Wolves cracked the Century Mark 58 times this year, one shy of the club single-season record of 59 set in 2013-14... Minnesota ranked 13th in the NBA in scoring (105.6 ppg) – the second-highest average in club history (106.9 ppg in 2013-14) – while setting franchise records in FG accuracy (46.7%, 8th in the NBA) and FT accuracy (79.9%, 5th in the NBA)... The Wolves also broke their previous single-season mark for three-pointers made (600 in 2013-14) by sinking 601, finishing the year 20th in long-distance accuracy at 34.9%, and set new records for Effective FG Percentage (51.1%) and True Shooting Percentage (55.5%)... Minnesota shot a season-best 56.3% vs. Dallas on Jan. 9, eclipsing the 55.8% showing in the Dec. 30 win vs. Milwaukee; they're 86-13 all-time when shooting 55% or better... The Wolves finished 15-for-31 from beyond the arc in the Dec. 26 win vs. Atlanta, the fifth time in club history they've made 15+ threes (second this season) and one of 16 times this season they made 10+ threes...

AT THE OTHER END: The Wolves closed the season by permitting 100+ points in each of their final 19 contests (Mar. 10-Apr. 12), the second-longest such streak in franchise history behind a 24-game run in 1991-92... For the year, Minnesota ranked 18th in scoring defense (106.7 ppg), 28th in defensive FG percentage (47.5%) and 26th in Defensive Rating (109.1); those numbers were 23rd (106.0 ppg), 28th (47.1%) and 27th (107.1), respectively, in 2015-16... In dropping 13 of their final 16 games, the Wolves surrendered 114.6 ppg (a Defensive Rating of 117.1) and a combined 51.2% accuracy from the floor... Utah finished at 60.0% on Apr. 7, the third 60%+ effort allowed by the Wolves this season; Portland shot 63.4% on Mar. 25 (the 4th-highest percentage ever by a Minnesota opponent) while New Orleans shot 60.0% on Feb. 10... The Wolves held Utah to 38.9% on Mar. 1, their sixth sub-40% defensive effort in 2016-17; the Jazz' 80 points matched the fewest allowed by Minnesota this year (also Nov. 1 vs. Memphis)... Houston erupted for 142 points on Feb. 25; the combined 272 points represent the highest-scoring regulation game in franchise history... The Rockets finished 22-for-58 from beyond the arc in that game, the most three-point makes and attempts ever by a Wolves opponent...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded seven of its eight April opponents, after coming up short in six of its final seven March starts... Overall, the Wolves ranked 5th in the NBA in total rebounding pct (.516, the third-best percentage in franchise history), 3rd in offensive rebounding pct (.272), 20th in defensive rebounding pct (.759) and 7th in rebounding margin (+2.0 rpg)...
